Show Christ's love to the people around you! Let His love flow through you to touch the life of those you come into contact with. His love is the greatest gift that we will ever receive!

Here are a few books from our Library...

<u>Grace</u> by Max Lucado. Grace is simply another word for God's reservoir of strength and protection. It comes not occasionally, but constantly and aggressively, wave upon wave. We barely regain our balance from one wave, and then "bam!", here comes another. "Grace Upon Grace" He has enough grace to pardon every sin and answer every questions. It's more than we deserve and greater than we imagine.

What's So Amazing About Grace by Philip Yancey. There is nothing we can do to make God love us more and there is nothing we can do to make God love us less. The author gives us a probing look at grace: what it looks like...what it doesn't look like...and why only Christians can and must reveal the grace the world is searching for. We speak of grace often, but do we really understand it? More importantly, do we really believe in it...and do our lives proclaim it as powerfully as our words? And, why only Christians can and must reveal the grace the world is searching for.

<u>The Victorious Christian</u> by Tony Evans. God gave us everything we will ever need when we became Christians. "Our challenge is not to ask God to bless us, but to grab hold of what we already possess." The author shows each of us how to gain – or regain – the momentum necessary to sustain a lifelong drive toward triumphant spirituality.
