It's the only way to live, the only path to authentic and meaningful relationships. In this book he shares some of the principle for building such relationships and keeping them healthy.

<u>Out Live Your Life</u> by Max Lucado. We are common folk. We sit in the bleachers, eat at diners, change diapers, and wear our favorite team's ball cap. Servants don't scurry when we come home.
