<u>Custodian</u> Rhonda Purtle In 1 Corinthians 15:1 Paul says, "Moreover, brethren, I declare to you the gospel..." Then in verses 3-4 he sets forth three basic historical truths of the Christian faith. Our faith does not rest on sand castles but it is firmly rooted on historical fact. Paul sets forth gospel truth in three succinct statements.



Statement number one, "Christ died for our sins." Now when it says "Christ died for our sins" that just simply means that Christ paid for our sins. It is not unusual for a person to die; Hebrews 9:27 says "it is appointed for man to die once." You pick up the newspaper and you read the daily obituary column and you read the fact that regardless of how long they may have lived sooner or later people die. But we know that when Jesus died He died like nobody who ever lived. We know that Jesus Christ did not die because He was a sinner but Jesus' death was a death in the place of sinners. "Christ died," here's the key, "for our sins." It means Jesus took our place when He died on Calvary's cross. He took my place, He took my guilt, He took my punishment; He died for me. So when the Bible says Christ died that's not enough; it is that Christ died for our sins.

Statement number two, "He was buried," that means Christ put away our sins. When Jesus was buried it just simply means that our sins were laid in that tomb with Him, it means that our sins have been put away out of sight. There is a hymn entitled, "One Day", and there's a line in that hymn which says, "Buried He carried my sins far away." And, that's what it means when Jesus was buried in that tomb.

You see, Paul says the gospel, the good news, is that He died. That is, He paid for our sins. He was buried; that means He put away our sins. Ah, but statement number three says "He rose again the third day according to the scriptures." He prevailed over our sins. You see, three days later Jesus Christ came out of that grave alive and He is still alive. That is the most astounding truth of the Christian faith: it is the truth that Jesus is not dead somewhere in a tomb outside Jerusalem but that He is alive, that He is moving in the city of Spring Hill touching lives and changing hearts. That's the good news of the Lord Jesus Christ. Let's celebrate that fact this Easter!

Maury Baptist Association Disaster Relief Training April 4-5 at Thompson Station Church


Friday, April 4: Introduction / Recertification to DR. Registration 6 pm. Training begins 6:30 pm.


