The 10 Commandments of Social Media (Facebook, etc.)

Social media connects us virtually with people from the various geographical and temporal periods of our lives. Our friends and followers have personalities and values that stretch to the edges of society. Some are liberal, others are conservative; some believe in God while others don't. We, as Christians, want to influence people for good. So, here are The 10 Commandments of Facebook Communications to help you speak truth and show love.

1. Thou Shall Keep Facebook Light. People post pictures of their kids here. They didn't sign up for political and/or cultural debates.

2. Thou Shall Watch Thy Typing. Everything you say can and will be used against you. You can't solve every problem or answer every argument so stick to the issues, and don't start ranting.

3. Thou Shalt Not Be Rude. Making one set of friends laugh is not worth offending the rest of your friends. Vulgarity, being disrespectful and condescending attitudes aren't Fruit of the Spirit.

4. Thou Shall Remember a Soul is Behind That Screen Name. Don't say anything online you wouldn't say to someone in person. Treat people as those whom Jesus loves.

8. Thou Shalt Not Hold Back Truth, But Don't Cast Your Pearls Before Swine. We can't be afraid to share what we believe, but we don't have to share everything with everyone at anytime. Keep your conversation filled with the clear message of love expressed in Christ.


