October - Where Is God?

Perhaps this is a difficult time for you. In a low moment you may wonder "where is God?"

Here are a few books from our Library:

<u>Approaching God</u> by Steve Brown. The author discovered that prayer can be quite honest. We can come to God without fear and without a concern for sophistication and slickness. Brown explores the practical side of praying - the amount of time we give to it, the time of day, even the most helpful posture. He helps us understand the "deeper" side of prayer - the awe and wonder of relating to a great God.

<u>What Matters Most</u> by Tony Evans. God's goal for believers is that they become more like Christ. This process is called discipleship. It consists of four essential elements. The author explores the importance of worship, fellowship, education, & outreach.

<u>Simple Faith</u> by Charles Swindoll. With typically penetrating insights and often humorous illustrations, the author shows how you can walk with Christ down a quieter path. Rediscover a life of peace and fulfillment built not on works but on trust and simple faith.

From the Church Office

October is "Clergy Appreciation" month...

Many articles come through the church office and when this one came, I knew I wanted to share it with you...

...A Great Pastor Appreciation Gift...Prayer

- 1. Prayer is a gift. Prayer changes things. God hears our prayers, and He answers them. In Colossians 4:2-4, Paul asks the regular Christians in one of his churches to pray for him. You'd think Paul would be doing the praying and not asking for prayer. Pray like it's free, because it is.
- 2. All prayers matter. Paul, an Apostle, was good at praying; he saw people healed and the dead rise up. Why would he need "regular-people-prayers?" Paul knew that prayer works because the One hearing the prayer is awesome, mighty, powerful and anyone can reach him through faith in Jesus. Pray like God hears you, because he does.
- 3. Prayers open doors. Paul, a man sent by the Spirit, asked for doors to open. Many people might forget to ask for prayer if they were sent out by the Holy Spirit, but not Paul. He wanted more opportunities to share the gospel. Paul was a gospel sharing machine, but he wanted more. He knew their prayers would enable him to be more effective. Pray like things will change, because they will.
- **4. Prayers empower.** Paul wrote much of the New Testament, started numerous churches and led thousands to Christ. Still, he wanted more,

and he knew their prayers empowered his gospel presentation. Paul craved that God's Spirit would work through him and for that, he needed prayer. Pray your pastors' messages change lives, because they can.

Remember prayers matter.

- **Don't think your pastors don't need prayer.** If Paul needed prayer, your pastors need it more.
- **Don't think your prayers aren't special.** If Paul asked regular people for prayer, then regular people prayers work.
- Pray for your pastors often. Pray doors open, pray the message is clear, and pray they will be empowered.
- Prayers are free, but not cheap. Our prayers work because of Christ's work on the cross. Pray boldly in Jesus' name.

Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving. At the same time, pray also for us, that God may open to us a door for the Word, to declare the mystery of Christ, on account of which I am in prison - that I may make it clear, which is how I ought to speak. Colossians 4:2-4.

Commit yourself to praying every day for your pastors - they will appreciate it! (article by Michael Jordan)
