The grandeur of the Christmas story, the glitter of the tinsel and lights, the greeting cards from our friends and loved ones, the carols, the gifts, the array of Christmas goodies, and the excitement in the eyes of the children are just a few of the ingredients that combine to make Christmas a most emotional time of the year!

Most often, the sadness of the season is caused by the fact that this will be the first Christmas without a loved one. However, a rediscovery of the true meaning of Christmas will dispel much of the sadness. For if Christmas means anything, it is the realization that not even death can eternally separate us from those we love in Christ. This is true because the little baby did not stay in a manger, but grew into a man who went to the cross to die for our sins and was resurrected the third day and is ascended back into heaven and is coming for us one day. He came to give us life and the promise of eternal life. Hallelujah, what a Savior!








In Acts Chapter 6 we see an example of what the early church was doing to reach out and help those in need. They were distributing food to the orphans and widows.
