

Speaking of names, Peter in 1 Peter 2:25 used a couple of names to describe Jesus. He says, "For you were like sheep going astray, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls." When Peter applies the name "Shepherd" to Jesus he is telling us something about what Jesus does. As a shepherd guided the sheep, even so Jesus guides the believer.

People are guided by many different things today. Some are guided by their peers. They do what the crowd is doing. Some are guided by their passions. Whatever feels good is what they do. Others are guided by their perceptions. Whatever seems to be right in their mind is what they do. However, our peers are sometimes wrong. Our passions are often distorted. Our perceptions are sometimes confused. We need something more reliable, and we have it in Jesus. Those who believe in Him, listen to Him, and follow Him have found Him to be a guide who has led them into full and abundant life.

The other name Peter uses in this verse is that of "Overseer." When Peter calls Him our overseer he is declaring that Jesus also guards us. At times He will guard us by delivering us from our trouble. At other times he will deliver us through our troubles.

Jesus is more than just a name! He is the one who guides and guards us in life. Proclaim Jesus to those around you, so that they, too, may be guided and guarded by Him.

Churches tend to fall into two ditches. Some elevate the music minister to rock star or "god-like" status. Or some treat the minister of music as a jukebox. Put a little bit of money in and get a few songs that they like. Both pitfalls promote an unhealthy view of the music minister and the music ministry.

So how should a church view the music minister and the music ministry?

First of all the primary responsibility of the music minister is to present the Gospel of Jesus Christ through song. Whether that be in congregational song, choir, soloist, etc... The texts of the song should preach the good news of Jesus Christ to us.

Second the music minister is responsible for singing songs of the faith that expresses the vast range of emotions that Christians go through during the course of their spiritual journey. Worship should be an acceptable place for all ranges of emotions from guilt, sadness, thankfulness, and joy.
