Here are a few books from our Library:

He Still Moves Stones by Max Lucado. The purpose of this book is not to tell us what Jesus did, but to tell us what Jesus does. That's the message of the New Testament - God doing for people what people cannot do themselves. That is the goal of this book - to witness the tenderness of Christ. And to be reminded that what He did then, He is willing to do today.

The Jesus I Never Knew by Philip Yancey. The author offers a new and different perspective on the life of Christ and His work: His teachings, His miracles, His death and resurrection, and ultimately, who He was and why He came. From the manger in Bethlehem to the cross in Jerusalem, the author presents a complex character who generates questions as well as answers; a disturbing and exhilarating Jesus who wants to radically transform your life and stretch your faith.

In the Grip of Grace by Max Lucado. Can anything separate us from the love Christ has for us? This is what we want to know. Does God really love us forever? How does God feel about me when I'm a jerk, when I snap at anything that moves, when my tongue is sharp enough to slice a rock. How does He feel about me then? The answer is found in one of life's sweetest words: GRACE.




