This month we will celebrate Independence Day in this nation. Independence was declared on July 4, 1776, which was 243 years ago. Is the America we now know the America they had in mind? Could their cry for liberty have really included sanctioning marriage between two people of the same sex? Could their insistence on individual liberty actually have meant they wanted our society to claim the right to take the lives of millions of unborn children? Would our forefathers want our nation to change from a free market society to become a socialist state? And do we still have the national will and resolve to stand up for right and oppose evil; or are we now being so overrun with evil that those who oppose it find themselves in a swiftly shrinking minority? Is this the United States of America they had in mind? I don't think so! We need to cry out to God as 2 Chronicles 7:14 says and turn from our wicked ways and ask God to forgive our sins and heal our land!

The Pregnancy Centers of Middle Tennessee

2019 First Quarter statistics have been released from the Pregnancy Centers. They continue to do amazing pro-life work on a part-time basis in Columbia and Spring Hill. The Staff conducted 341 parenting classes, 27 ultrasounds, 20 pregnancy tests, and distributed over

2,600 materials.

The Jail ministry included 45 budget classes and 62 parenting classes. Twenty inmates have graduated from two of the budget and parenting classes. One inmate has requested a mentor upon release.
