As we come into February, we begin to think about love, primarily because of Valentine's Day. How do we know that God really loves us? 1 John 3:16 say, "By this we know love, because He laid down His life for us." We know that God love us "because He (Jesus) laid down His life for us." The love of Jesus for us caused Him to lay down His life to save us. It was voluntary; nobody took His life away from Him. He laid His life down!



He not only laid His life down voluntarily, He also laid it down vicariously. *"He laid down His life for us."* That means He died on that cross for you and for me. Doesn't it make you fall in love with Him all over again? If we could live 10,000 years, we could never thank Him enough for laying down His life on the cross.

Well, because He did that John says in verse 17, "we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren." He laid His life down to save; we ought to lay our life down to serve. That's the way we ought to live. You know, it's a wonderful way to live, to live for others. So many people just live for themselves but, oh, friends, if you really want o know how to live, learn to live for others.

William Booth was the founder of the Salvation Army. He was unable to attend one of their annual conferences and so they requested that he send them a telegram message. So, when the telegram arrived at the convention, they were all anxious to hear what profound message General Booth would have for them in their conference. When the telegram was opened and it was read, it was one word. Here's what he sent to them: **"Others."**

You see, love makes you live for others. But if there is miserliness in your heart, love cannot be there. 1 John 3:17 says, "But whoever has this world's goods, and sees his brother in need, and shuts up his heart from him, how does the love of God abide in him?" It is not talking here about the person who has an abundance of goods; it means the person who just simply has the necessities of life. Did you know when Jesus saw a need He was immediately drawn to it. When we see a need, it ought to draw our heart of compassion. The words "shuts up" there really mean to slam a door, or to lock a lock. So, he says if you see somebody with need and you slam the door, or if you turn the key on the lock, "how does the love of God abide in you."

Valentine's Day, like most other holidays, has become overly commercialized. We feel obligated to purchase cards, chocolates, roses, and more for the ones we romantically love. And, of course, we also include others we love on our Valentine's giving list: mom, children, etc. But have you expressed your love to God lately by serving Him? Have you expressed God's love to someone else lately by serving them? 1 John 3:18 says, "*My little children, let us not love in word or in tongue, but in deed and in truth.*" God didn't just say, "I love you!" Romans 5:8 says, "But God **demonstrates** His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us!" We need to show others the love we have for them by our service to them.
