



for all areas of church service; committees, children's workers, Sunday School teachers...I ran across this the other day about the origin & importance of Sunday School...

Sunday school began in England as early as 1751. Better known is Robert Raikes' work in Gloucester 30 years later. Concerned about poor children who worked in factories six days a week and often turned to crime, he offered classes on the only day kids were free. Soon various organizations offered a loose network of such Sunday schools, which taught basic reading and writing, using the Bible as a text.

Ten years later, Samuel Slater started the first U.S. Sunday school in his Rhode Island textile mills. By the mid-1800s, Sunday school attendance was an almost-universal childhood experience. As society became more secular and public education was mandated by the 1870s, Sunday ACS Church Life...And...It is FREE!! You schools focused on spiritual practices: prayers, hymns, catechism knowledge and Scripture memorization.

> Well into the 20th century, Sunday school served as the church's main outreach tool. Many adults fondly remember their teachers and lessons, and Sunday school continues to play a significant part in faith Paule, Ministry Assistant development.
