Have you ever noticed the words that surround the event of the resurrection? The women who approached the tomb were greeted by an angel. The words that the angel spoke helped them to better understand the glorious resurrection of Jesus Christ. The message that was given to them needs to be given to everyone. In Matthew 28:1-8 there are some words for our celebration of Easter.



The first word, found in verse 6, is a word of invitation - $\underline{Come.}$ There was much at could have hindered the women from coming. It was a graveyard, it was early in the morning, Rome had sealed the tomb, this was a holy place and their own sin could have hindered them. Yet, the women were not hindered by those things. Nothing should hinder our service to Christ!

Second, the angel said, "<u>See</u> the place where the Lord lay." When we see the place where the Lord lay it will cause us to say, "It is my sin that brought Him to that end." Then we will begin to develop a proper awareness of sin and hatred for it. You and I are guilty of the death of Christ. We were there and our sins were to blame for His death!

Having been invited to "come" and "see," now the angel tells us that we must "go quickly and tell." Having come to Christ and experienced His power, having come to the grave and realized the reality of His resurrection, we now have a message that needs to be shared with the world. Notice that the angel tells them to "go quickly." There is an urgency about our message. We must go quickly because people are dying. we must go quickly because Christ is coming. If we have come, if we have seen that the tomb is empty, and if we are commissioned to go, then it is inevitable that we will have a message tell to those we encounter. The Good News must be told. The Good News that Christ died for our sins, the He was placed in a tomb, but on the third day He rose bodily, triumphantly from the grave. And because of that we can have forgiveness of sin. The greatest news in the world is the resurrection of Jesus Christ. THEY WILL NEVER COME UNTIL WE GO!!! How can we who are Christians fail to tell the world about it?

Community Opportunities

End Slavery TN

A new feature in the newsletter (as space allows) will attempt to inform our church family regarding events or activities which impact our community. This month will highlight *End Slavery TN* to increase awareness of Human Trafficking (HT) in Middle TN. HT victims are made to work or provide commercial sex in legitimate business settings, as well as underground markets. Other victims are walking around in plain view of our neighborhoods, primarily because the public is not well informed as to signs to watch for.

The following data is supplied by the US Justice Department, Department of Public Health, and others: Currently, 94-110 minors are trafficked each month in TN. The average age is 13 years. HT is more common than gangs and fast becoming a Middle TN "Hub" because of our many interstate connections (easy escape for perpetrators). The local Spring Hill *End Slavery* groups meets monthly and supports the activities of the Nasville area, including the "Safe House" for girls escaping slavery. Parents need to be aware that 76% of recruitment of minors occurs on the internet. Two web sites provide valuable information for parents: www.bethejam.org and www.endslaverytn.org
