<u>Custodian</u> Rhonda Purtle Ephesians 5:1 tells us to "Therefore be imitators of God as dear children." Every child at some time imitates his father. Every parent remembers fondly when their toddlers try to walk in their shoes or wear an item of their clothing. That is the meaning of this verse. The word translated "imitators" is the word from which we derive mimic. God wants us to imitate Him. Christ is our earthly example.

Certainly we are not redeemed by a holy walk, but such a life is pleasing to our Father. It is a natural outgrowth of a close relationship with Him, just as natural as the little boy walking in his father's shoes. A closer look at the words of the erse yields even more information. "As dear children" means as a favorite possession. In other words, we are to follow our Father as His favorite child would follow. Many times good parents are accused of having "pets." It should never be true that a parent favors one child over another. This verse tells us that each of the Heavenly Father's children can be His "pet." He is all-powerful and does not play favorites. Therefore, we can all be His "favorite."

1 John 3:1-2 says, "Behold, what manner of love the Father has bestowed on us, that we should be called children of God! Therefore the world does not know us, because it did not know Him. Beloved, now are we children of God, and it has not yet been revealed what we shall be, but we know that when He is revealed, we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is." God has a purpose for His children, a grand design. We are -- right now -- the children of God. We do not outwardly appear to be any different than the non-believer. But God knows His own! We are His!

If that great truth was not enough, God tells us more. "It has not yeat been revealed what we shall be." It's not that God does not know our future, but that He chooses not to disclose it now. But then He gives us a hint of things to come. "We know that when He is revealed, we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is!" All of our earthly journeys will intersect at one point -- Him! God has a purpose for His children. He has a design for us. Let us renew our allegiance to God, our Heavenly Father. Let us honor Him on this Father's Day as truly the world's greatest Dad!


