

When we study the Word of God we discover that the Lord expects us, in every area of our lives, to be faithful and accountable to Him. The stewardship area, how we relate ourselves to the matter of our finances, is certainly no exception. A good test of a church and test of us as individuals is how we respond to the matter of what we do with our money.

I have discovered that when a church starts hurting financially, it is not simply a problem of people not giving. The root of the problem goes much deeper. The main source of the financial problem is spiritual. See, if we are in tune with God then we will be obedient in our giving. So, as I see the shortfalls in our budget, I am greatly concerned, but not so much concerned at making ends meet as I am about the spiritual condition of our church.

In 2 Corinthians 8:1-5, Paul tells about the wonderful example of giving by the churches of Macedonia in a collection taken for the poor saints in Jerusalem. The offering that these churches gave was so sacrificial and noteworthy that Paul uses them as an example of genuine New Testament giving. The people of Macedonia were going through great trials and they themselves were experiencing great poverty. Yet, when the offering was given, the amount was unbelievable. Paul was amazed and astounded when he saw the faith and generosity of these poverty stricken Macedonian believers.

The key to the Macedonian believers' giving is found in 2 Corinthians 8:5 where Paul says, "they first gave themselves to the Lord, and then to us by the will of God." The reason they gave abundantly is because they first gave themselves to the Lord. The great need of our church is for the members of our church to put Jesus first in our lives. What is first in your life?

I am not trying to coerce and shame anyone into giving. I want us to put Jesus first in our lives. When we do that, the matter of giving will take care if itself.

Our world is quickly changing and communication is "device driven". Many of us have "smart phones", tablets, and other digital devices. With that in mind, our church directory is now available to church members from our web site. There is a link on our Home page under CONNECT called "Member to Member". A user id and password must be created to log in to a secure site. Information will not be out there for just anyone to access. You have the option to look up an individual or family and even print a copy from home. And, if information is incorrect, corrections may be submitted. You now have access to your own contribution records, register for events, create your own personal calendar and much more! On the log in page to the secure site, you will see Need a log in? Click here. Follow the steps to set up your account. You will receive an email letting you know you are ready to go.



There's an APP for that! Yes, there is a FREE app available for your smart phone/ mobile device called ACS Church Life. This will allow access to the church directory via your mobile device. Our church staff is already using the app. Once you have created your log on account in Member to Member, you can use this app.

There are two types of log in; one of those will ask for our **Site Number** which is **100346**. You may also log in using only your email address and password.

There are more upgrades to come: adding photos to the directory, new event registrations, and more. Eventually, these upgrades can even allow the possibility of online giving. If you have questions or need help with your log on, please call the church office.

**Special Note: Only those who are Active Members and Attenders of First Baptist Church of Spring Hill will be allowed access to the Member to Member section of the web site. Anyone can register for events through guest registration.
