As you know, we are in the process of finding workers in the various committees and classes. I want to share with you an article that I ran across from one of our former deacons, John Stebelton. He wrote this a few years ago. I asked permission to share this.

There is work to be done in churches today, but getting someone to volunteer is like picking the spots off a leopard. From the pulpit, pastors ask, and ask for God's people to step forward and fill positions in the church. What do they hear?



"I have no talent." "I served my time when I was younger and now I'm taking it easy." "I don't have time to prepare." "Well, Brother Pastor, I just don't feel God's calling."

We, as believers in Jesus Christ, should have a burning desire in our hearts to serve in our church whenever, wherever, and however we can. God will never ask us to do anything that He will not equip us to do. Where in God's Word does it say that when we get older, we're to stop serving Him? Christ suffered a horrible death so our sins would be forgiven and that we would have eternal life. Through His death, we become a child of God. And we say we've served our time, we're going to stop serving and take it easy. We can't find time to serve. That's the biggest bunch of donkey doo I've ever heard. (John's words, not mine.)

We can find time to serve worldly activities. We wouldn't think of missing our favorite television program or sporting event. We spend hours on our computer, but can't find time to serve the Lord. We don't feel called? I only have one thing to say about that, "We're not listening." We are not in His Word as we should be, and our prayer life is weak.

When God called Moses, he too, had all kinds of excuses why he was not the person to serve Him. God took all those excuses from him. In Exodus 4:1-2 we read, "Then Moses answered and said, 'But suppose they will not believe me or listen to my voice; suppose they say, The Lord has not appeared to you.' So the Lord said to him, 'What is that in your hand?' He said, 'A rod.'" Lord, I can't speak to people, Lord, I have no power, Lord I can't, Lord I can't. But God told Moses, "Yes you can, I'll give you everything you need to serve me." (John's translation) God asked Moses "What is that in your hand?" "Just a Shepherd's rod, Lord." God gave power to the rod and Moses used it to perform miracle after miracle as he led God's people out of Egypt and to the Promised Land.

God will take the smallest of talents, and use them in mighty ways. The old saying is, "God doesn't want our ability, He wants our availability." We are never too young or too old to serve God. My friends, I've used some of those excuses myself, and god brought conviction upon me until I became obedient, and allowed Him to use me in His service. If you are not serving the Lord in your Sunday school and church, you're missing a great blessing. It's not up to the other person, it's up to you, to be obedient and say, "Lord, where do you want me to serve?" (End of John's article)

I hope that you will respond with a "yes!" when the nominating committee asks you about a place of service. We need you to step up and take a place of service! We especially need workers in the Children's Sunday School and on Wednesday nights in Mission Friends and Children in Action!
