What does Christmas mean to you? To some people it means hard work. The stores are crowded with shoppers, the post office is overflowing with mail, and the buses and planes are carrying record crowds. To some people Christmas means a visit home. Surely this is the best time of all year to be with loved ones. To some people Christmas brings sadness. They look back over the year and think of the loved one who has left them since las Christmas. To some people Christmas means revelry. They talk about Christmas liquor; they connect whiskey with the name of the blessed Savior. To millions of people, Christmas means nothing. They do not know Jesus. December 25th for them, is just another day.

But Christmas means everything to the real Christian. It means that God loves us. It means that God has given us the best Christmas gift that He could possibly give. It means that our Savior is born:

- born to set an example with His life
- born to die for our sins
- born to be raised for our justification
- born to ascend on high and make intercession for us
- born to give us hope of His coming again to gather all believers unto Himself.

Christmas means that the Christian has a Companion for life. Yes, Christmas is special to the Christian.

How should we respond to all that God has done for us as a result of Christmas? First, we should respond with worship. When Jesus was born a wonderful miracle of nature took place. The heavens opened and an angel came down to speak to a group of shepherds on a Judean hill. Luke 2:10-12 says, *Unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, which is Christ the Lord. You will find Him wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger.* The shepherds went to town, found the baby and knelt down and worshipped Him. When the Wise Men found Jesus, Matthew tells us that they *fell down, and worshipped him* (Matt. 2:11). If we are going to have a meaningful Christmas, we must worship Him also.

Second, we should respond by giving. After Christ was born the wise men came bearing their gifts to Him. They brought god, frankincense, and myrrh. Each gift was a gift of value. What gifts are we giving to Him? Are we giving ourselves? Are we giving our time, our talents, and our treasure to Him? Think about what Christ has given to us. Look at the cross! Yet we look at the attendance records and find that many church members haven't given one hour to Jesus in the past year. We look at the financial records and find that many have not given one penny in the past year. Must Jesus give all and are we to give nothing in return?

Third, we should respond by witnessing. For our first picture here, we look up and listen to the angel. The angel brought the sweetest message the world ever heard. In fact, the world has never been the same since then. The second picture we see is the shepherds. After the shepherds had seen the baby, they went out to spread the glad tidings. They went to tell the glorious story of Jesus to everyone they met. That is what we need to do today. The world needs this message! If we take the message of Christ to them, life will never be the same for them again.

So, this Christmas season let us do these three things: Let us bow down and worship Him, let us bring our gifts to Him, and let us tell others the sweet old story of Jesus and His love.
